THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT IDENTIFIED IN THE ATTACHED TWO (2) PAGE LIST ARE NO LONGER ADEQUATE FOR THE NEEDS OF THE COUNTY DUE TO THEIR AGE, CONDITION, AND REDUCTION IN FLEET.

STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT THE AUTOMOTIVE SERVICES MANAGER BE AUTHORIZED TO DISPOSE OF THESE VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT BY PUBLIC AUCTION AND, WHERE APPROPRIATE, PRIVATE SALE AT A NEGOTIATED PRICE.

**RESOLUTION DECLARING CERTAIN COUNTY MOTOR VEHICLES AND  
EQUIPMENT SURPLUS PROPERTY AND AUTHORIZING THEIR SALE  
(GENERAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT)**

**WHEREAS**, Forsyth County owns certain motor vehicles and equipment, identified in the attached two (2) page list and incorporated herein by reference, which vehicles and equipment are no longer useful to the County and should be declared surplus to the County's needs and disposed of by sale; and

**WHEREAS**, the County wishes to dispose of said motor vehicles and equipment by public auction or private sale at a negotiated price pursuant to the provisions of N.C.G.S. 153A-176, N.C.G.S. 160A-266, N.C.G.S. 160A-270 and N.C.G.S. 160A-267.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners, on behalf of Forsyth County, as follows:

1. The motor vehicles and equipment, more particularly described in the attached list (consisting of two pages) and incorporated herein by reference, are no longer useful to the County due to their age or condition and are, therefore, hereby declared surplus property of Forsyth County.
2. Pursuant to the provisions of G.S. 153A-176, G.S. 160A-266, G.S. 160A-270 and G.S. 160A-267, the Automotive Services Manager is hereby authorized to dispose of the motor vehicles and equipment described herein by public auction or private sale at a negotiated price upon the following terms and conditions:
  - A. The sale shall be by public auction to the highest bidder and payment must be made on the date of the sale by cash or check. If payment is made by check, the title, keys, and vehicle or equipment will only be transferred after the check has cleared the bank (normally 3 to 4 business days). Any bid may be rejected at the sale if the bid is below the current scrap value of the vehicle or equipment or for any other reason which the Automotive Services Manager determines to be in the best interest of the County.
  - B. Should the Automotive Services Manager reject any bid on a motor vehicle or equipment, he is authorized to dispose of said motor vehicle or equipment, if valued at less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), by private sale at a negotiated price either as scrap or to another purchaser pursuant to the provisions of G.S. 160A-267.
  - C. The sale shall be held on Saturday, July 27, 2013 at 9:00a.m. at the Forsyth County Fleet Surplus Lot, located at 1200 Fairchild Drive in the City of Winston-Salem, N.C.
3. For items sold by public auction, this resolution or a notice summarizing its contents, sufficient to comply with G.S. 160A-270 shall be published at least once and not less than ten days before the date of the auction.
4. For items sold by private sale at a negotiated price, a notice summarizing the contents of this Resolution, sufficient to comply with G.S. 160A-267, shall be published once after adoption of this Resolution and no sale shall be consummated thereunder until ten days after its publication.
5. This resolution shall be effective upon adoption.

  - A. The sale shall be by public auction to the highest bidder and payment must be made on the date of the sale by cash or check. If payment is made by check, the title, keys, and vehicle or equipment will only be transferred after the check has cleared the bank (normally 3 to 4 business days). Any bid may be rejected at the sale if the bid is below the current scrap value of the vehicle or equipment or for any other reason which the Automotive Services Manager determines to be in the best interest of the County.
  - B. Should the Automotive Services Manager reject any bid on a motor vehicle or equipment, he is authorized to dispose of said motor vehicle or equipment, if valued at less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), by private sale at a negotiated price either as scrap or to another purchaser pursuant to the provisions of G.S. 160A-267.
  - C. The sale shall be held on Saturday, July 27, 2013 at 9:00a.m. at the Forsyth County Fleet Surplus Lot, located at 1200 Fairchild Drive in the City of Winston-Salem, N.C.
3. For items sold by public auction, this resolution or a notice summarizing its contents, sufficient to comply with G.S. 160A-270 shall be published at least once and not less than ten days before the date of the auction.
4. For items sold by private sale at a negotiated price, a notice summarizing the contents of this Resolution, sufficient to comply with G.S. 160A-267, shall be published once after adoption of this Resolution and no sale shall be consummated thereunder until ten days after its publication.
5. This resolution shall be effective upon adoption.
